## Where Does Your Money Go?

Trustee vs Operating Account

There's a lot of behind the scenes "stuff" that occurs here at FWC. Some is easy to spot and some is not. Maybe some of you have had questions about the money that is spent and never dared ask, "What is my money used for?" Or, maybe you see things changing and wonder where the money came from to pay for them. I am going to try to break some of it down for you. I will start with the basics and give more specific costs details in the next newsletter.

The first thing I need to explain are the different bank accounts we have. FWC has four different accounts; Trustee's, **Operating**, Food Pantry and Memorial. The Trustee's account is used for things such as building and equipment repairs, paint, new equipment, taxes, and that account is funded from interest of matured investments, profit of property sales or from trust funds that individuals have left to us in their wills. Next, the Operating Account. It is bankrolled by your tithing, rent money, and (cont. above)

fundraising events money received with the exception of the First Friday Feasts. That goes into the Kitchen Fund. Also, the Missions Group gets 10% of ALL our fundraisers so they can buy materials necessary to do their work. The Operating account pays the salaries of our four employees (Pastor Brad, Lynné, Malcolm and Lisa). It also pays for our utilities (gas, electric and, security monitoring, internet service), office supplies insurances and other costs that we pay in order for the church to run smoothly on a daily basis. The Food Pantry and Memorial accounts are both separate and each has specific criteria to be used. We do have a couple members that offer to pay certain bills on top of their tithing which is really a additional blessing to FWC. So, for now, this is some insight about the bank accounts we have and where your money goes. Don't worry though, I will have additional information next time about how much money and on what, the S.A.L.T Committee has approved spending from the Trustee's account on. So until next time...
