
In Case You Didn't Know

In case you hadn't heard, there was a government shutdown in October/November and as a result many people in Fulton County and around the country did not receive their Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) allotment in November until late in the month. With Thanksgiving being in November, SNAP being unavailable put our Food Pantry in a tight bind.

BUT! We are extremely blessed to say the least.

Between all of you, some very kind neighbors, food drive collections and several local businesses we pushed through and have been able to supply people with turkeys for Thanksgiving and still have a freezer FULL of protein options and shelves stocked with

fruits and veggies. We finished out the month with providing 750 people enough food to have three meals for three days. Plus, we were able to give out a few extras like jelly to go with the jar of peanut butter or a dessert. We even sponsored one family of five, that is near and dear to many in the Food Pantry (and Office). We supplied them with ALL the fixings for a Thanksgiving meal, including a gallon of milk, a pound of butter, dinner rolls and dessert. The family is extremely grateful. The mom is home from the hospital, after having a heart attack and renal failure. She is preparing the food little by little with the kids help. My mom always said, to give is so much better than to receive. And of course, she was right!
