Stewardship Accountability

Foothills Worship Center came to fruition in July 2022. Of course, we had moving and set-up expenses that goes along with, well...moving. We bought the John Deer Tractor, chairs for the chapel, paint to cover up the primary colors in the chapel and we purchased flooring leading into the chapel to update the teal and purple tiled carpet. However, it wasn't until 2023 we started putting some of our money into the rest of the building for some repairs and esthetic improvements. If you recall from the last two newsletters I told you about our two spending accounts. The Operating account and the Trustee's account. So, just a recap, the Operating Account also referred to as the General Fund is used for our everyday bills or similar to how you would typically use your own checking account. The Trustee's Account or sometimes referred to as the building fund is our savings account. Kind of like your house. If something has to be fixed, you go to your savings that you have set aside for expenses like a new hot water tank or heating issues that need to be fixed. That is exactly how we are allocating our financial stewardship here. Shortly after moving in, we realized we had leaking skylights so in 2023 we had those fixed. Then in 2024 we started to perform upkeep and enhancements on the rest of the building to make it more functional and welcoming. We upgraded the lights which would save us money in the long run. We refinished the gym floor, purchased new electric pianos, TV and cameras, and started repairing the boiler, alarm system and giving the halls a facelift with new paint. Moving forward to this year, 2025. We have made more boiler repairs, toilet and sink repairs...remember most if not all of the plumbing is original equipment from 1966. In addition to those repairs, we fixed the picnic tables out on the playground, power washed the mold and mildew off the building, bought a AC mini-split for the food pantry freezer room so the equipment in there wouldn't overheat. Then the biggie for this year was the paved parking lot for the food pantry and chapel. All-in-all, the past three years a total of \$127,400 was spent out of our savings. It sounds like a lot because it is. BUT we have had a couple trusts (money from people who passed away and left money to FWC) disbursed. S.A.L.T members are trying to be good stewards of the money and investments we have. After all their name has accountability right in it.


The most beautiful thing is to see a person smiling. And even more beautiful, is knowing that you are the reason behind it!


